







Whitechapel Gallery Plantón Móvil



Whitechapel Gallery this summer brings Lucia Monge's international project Plantón Móvil to East London. Working with Willow Brook Primary School over a two week residency in June the Peruvian artist is developing a new iteration of her 'walking forest' event.

'Plantón' is the Spanish word for a sapling, a young tree that is ready to be planted into the ground; it is also the word for a sit in. This project takes on both, the green to be planted and the peaceful declaration.

With handmade carrying systems a forest of native plants will be strapped to people and pushed along on wheels, giving plants the opportunity to 'walk' down the streets of a city that is also theirs. We lend our mobility to plants so that they can benefit from the speed and scale that draws people's attention. In return, we may momentarily borrow some of their slowness.








Graham Clifford
